### **REGISTRATION NOW OPEN FOR THE DELAWARE LOTTERY DOVER DAYS CORNHOLE TOURNEY**

DOVER, DE -- Get your pitching arm in shape and register today for the Delaware Lottery Dover Days Cornhole Tournament, set for Friday, May 6, Legislative Mall in Dover starting at 6 p.m.

The tournament is one of the highlights of the Dover Days "Tourism Gives Back" Friday night preview event that will also feature a judged car show, live oldies music by The Honeycombs, food vendors, children's activities, plus candlelight tours at the 2nd Delaware Regiment Volunteers' Civil War encampment. Registration fees apply for car show entries and cornhole tournament participants, but general admission to the Friday night festivities is free and open to the public.

If you've never heard of cornhole, it's a competitive bean bag competition that is sweeping the nation. The American Cornhole Association's website ([www.playcornhole.org](http://www.playcornhole.org)) says that cornhole has been called many things: Corn toss, bean bag, bean toss, soft horseshoes and Indiana horseshoes, but to those born and raised in Kentucky and the southern part of Ohio, the game is passionately referred to as cornhole.

This May 6 tournament, exclusively sponsored by Delaware Lottery, is being managed for the Dover Days Festival by Kings of Corn of Georgetown, DE. It will be a double-elimination tournament with 32 teams of two. Cost is \$40 per team in advance; \$50 night of the event if not sold out in advance. Cash prizes will be awarded of up to \$400.
